Trampoline Needs to Be Made Inaccessible to Children Netting at the Base Is Ripped and Open, Chair Was Placed Close to the Trampoline Which Allowed for Easier Access. Correct Immediately. (2), and At the Time of the Inspection, the Gate Was Missing at the Missing at the Restricted Room and at the Bottom of the Stairs Leading to the Upper Level. Provider Put Gates in Place Immediately. (2). None of the 14 findings were critical.
