(4) and Lighting Requirements for Rooms Used by Children Were Not Met as Evidenced by Lighting Was Insufficient to Observe and Supervise Children in That the Side of the Room That the Infant/toddlers Were Napping Was So Dark That the Staff Had to Use the Flashlight on Their Phone for CI Cox to Be Able to Se (1).
