The Other Gate Is Locked with a Key and the Key Is Supposed to Be on the Ledge on the Building Next to Th (3) and Outdoor Equipment, KidKroft Play House, in Play Yard Was Not in Good Condition as Evidenced by Cross Board in the Back Is Broken in the Middle Creating Sharp Edges on Both Sides.
