(1), and The Operator Did Not Review the EPR Plan Annually or When Information in the Plan Changed to Ensure All Information Is Current. (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.

One infant was observed being served a bottle while lying in the pack n play. Bottles were propped. A second infant was given a bottle while in a rocker. Violation confirmed corrected by letter rece

● **Copy of Each Child's Immunization Record, Including the Operator's Own Preschool Child(ren), Was Not on File.**

A immunization report was not on file for one preschool child enrolled on May 28, 2024. Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from provider on 4/8/2026

● **The Operator Did Not Review the EPR Plan Annually or When Information in the Plan Changed to Ensure All Information Is Current.**

Documentation was not on file verifying annual review of the EPR plan. The last documented review date was May 9, 2024. Violation confirmed corrected by lett
