None of the 5 findings were critical.

A set of bottles were dated for 04/10 and one set of bottle were not labeled with name and date. Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from provider on 4/28/2026

● **A Current Activity Plan Was Not Posted for Each Group of Children for Reference.**

An activity plan was not available for classroom for one year old children. Activity plan was completed, printed, and posted in classroom area prior to visit ending. Violation corrected during visit

● **Each Employee's Personnel File Did Not Contain an Annual Staff Development Plan.**

Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from provider on 10/27/2025

Jul 2, 2025 1 Finding ● 1 Important

● **Shelter-in-place or Lockdown Drills Were Not Practiced Every Three Months And/or Drill Record Was Incomplete.**

An emergency drill has not been conducted since March 27, 2025. Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from provider on 7/18/2025
