Operator did not submit the original approved report to DCDEE within one week of the inspection visit on a form provided by the Division. The last fire inspection was from January 20
- **Staff/child Ratios Applicable to a Classroom, Were Not Posted in Each Classroom.**
Staff/child ratios were not posted in three (3) classrooms. Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from provider on 3/9/2026
- **Prior to Employment a Criminal Background Check Was Not Completed.**
The interim director did not have a criminal background check completed, hers had expired. Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from provider on 3/9/2026
- **A Valid Qualification Letter Was Not on File and Available to Review at the Facility.**
Two (2) staff members did not have valid qualification letters on file; one staff member was qualified; however, her letter was not on file. Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from prov
