Across 2 inspections since 2025, the issues cited most often were Staff Did Not Wash Their Hands Thoroughly Before Beginning Work, Before/after Handling Food, Before Bottle Feeding or Serving to Other Children, After... (1), Equipment and Furnishings Were Not Sturdy, Stable and Free of Hazards. (1), and Openings in Equipment, Steps, Decks, Handrails, and Fencing Were Not Less Than 3 1/2 Inches or Greater Than 9 Inches. (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.

● **Staff Did Not Wash Their Hands Thoroughly Before Beginning Work, Before/after Handling Food, Before Bottle Feeding or Serving to Other Children, After...**

toileting or handling body fluids, after diaper changing and after handling soiled items. One (1) staff member did not wash hands upon

● **Equipment and Furnishings Were Not Sturdy, Stable and Free of Hazards.**

Safety mesh was added to the part of the fence by the garden box to make up the height of the fence. The Mesh is not sturdy material to meet the purpose of the fence. Violation confirmed corrected by follow-up visit

● **Openings in Equipment, Steps, Decks, Handrails, and Fencing Were Not Less Than 3 1/2 Inches or Greater Than 9 Inches.**

One (1) side of the fence, where pots and pans were hung, was partially separated from the top bar. The separation extended approximately four (4) feet, with gaps rang

● **Outdoor Play Area Was Not Enclosed by Fence with a Minimum Height of 4 Feet.**

The top of the fence, less than six feet, was not free from protrusions. One (1) side of the fence, where pots and pans were hung, was partially separated from the top bar and the portions of the fence measur
