(1), A Drug or Medication Was Administered Without Written Authorization And/or Instructions From a Child's Parent or Authorized Health Professional. (1), and All Walls and Ceilings Including Doors and Windows Were Not Kept Clean, Free of Visible Fungal Growth, and in Good Repair. (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.

A child was drinking a bottle of milk while laying on the cot at rest time. Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from provider on 4/3/2026

● **A Drug or Medication Was Administered Without Written Authorization And/or Instructions From a Child's Parent or Authorized Health Professional.**

Two emergency medicines had an action plan but not parent permission to administer the medication. Violation confirmed corrected by letter r

Oct 13, 2025 3 Findings ● 3 Important

● **All Walls and Ceilings Including Doors and Windows Were Not Kept Clean, Free of Visible Fungal Growth, and in Good Repair.**

There are several broken blinds that needs to be replaced. Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from provider on 10/24/2025

● **Toxic Plants Were Accessible to Children.**

A plant that is considered toxic was hanging lower than five (5) feet. The plant was sent to the office until they could get a higher hook installed. Violation corrected during visit
