Across 3 inspections since 2025, the issues cited most often were Medications Including Prescription and Non-prescription Items Were Not Stored in a Locked Cabinet or Other Locked Container. (1), Health and Safety Training Topics Were Not Included as Part of On-going Training Within Five Years of Completing the Previous Health and Safety Training Topics. (1), and All Equipment and Furnishings Were Not in Good Repair. (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.

- **Medications Including Prescription and Non-prescription Items Were Not Stored in a Locked Cabinet or Other Locked Container.**

In space #5, a tube of Triamcinolone Acetonide Cream USP 0.1% was stored on a shelf above the handwashing sink. Violation corrected during visit

- **Health and Safety Training Topics Were Not Included as Part of On-going Training Within Five Years of Completing the Previous Health and Safety Training Topics.**

A staff member hired on 3/2/20 did not complete Health & Safety Training by 6/21/25. Violation confirmed corrected by letter

Dec 3, 2025 1 Finding ● 1 Important

- **All Equipment and Furnishings Were Not in Good Repair.**

In the outdoor space used by preschoolers, the foam barrier around the base of the shade structure was torn causing a large hole. Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from provider on 12/8/2025

Jun 4, 2025 2 Findings ● 2 Important

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- **A Safe Indoor and Outdoor Environment Was Not Provided for the Children.**

The outdoor carpet on the toddler playground was rolled up in several places causing tripping hazards. On the preschool playground, thorns were found around the stationary climbers and around the barrier of the m
