Across 3 inspections since 2024, the issues cited most often were All Staff Did Not Successfully Complete Certification in First Aid Appropriate to the Age of Children in Care. (1), Shelter-in-place or Lockdown Drills Were Not Practiced Every Three Months And/or Drill Record Was Incomplete. (1), and NC Pre-K Program Staff/child Ratios and Group Sizes Were Not Met. (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.

- **All Staff Did Not Successfully Complete Certification in First Aid Appropriate to the Age of Children in Care.**
Verification of staff completion of First Aid training from an approved training organization was not in the staff file. A. Bittle hired 9/22/25 did not have First Aid certi
- **Shelter-in-place or Lockdown Drills Were Not Practiced Every Three Months And/or Drill Record Was Incomplete.**
A shelter-in-place or lockdown drill was completed in August 2025 and again on 3/3/26. Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from provider on 4/13/2026

- **NC Pre-K Program Staff/child Ratios and Group Sizes Were Not Met.**
Upon arrival to conduct today's visit classroom space #2 was observed having one teacher, D. Estridge, present with sixteen (16) children. Violation confirmed corrected by follow-up visit made by consultant on 4/29/202
