None of the 5 findings were critical.

● **Center Did Not Maintain a Record of Daily Attendance.**

In Space 1, two(2) children that were present were not signed in on the attendance record. Four(4) days of attendance records did not have the dates. Violation corrected during visit

Mar 25, 2025 1 Finding ● 1 Important

● **All Equipment and Furnishings Were Not in Good Repair.**

There were seven(7) cracks in the surfacing under the stationary equipment that needs repair. Five(5) deflated balls were removed from the playground. Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from provider on 4/4/2025

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
