Across 4 inspections since 2025, the issues cited most often were Electrical Cords Were Accessible to Infants and Toddlers. (1), A Written Statement From Each Child's Parent Giving Standing Permission Which May Be Valid for Up to Twelve Months for Participation in Off Premise Activities... (1), and Medication Authorization, Giving the Caregiver Standing Authorization Did Not Meet the Specifications in Rule. (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.

● **Electrical Cords Were Accessible to Infants and Toddlers.**

A cord to a radio was accessible to toddler children in space 2; the radio could have toppled over off a shelf and caused an injury to a child. Violation corrected during visit
