Across 3 inspections since 2024, the issues cited most often were A Child Was Handled in a Rough Way, Including Shaking, Pushing, Shoving, Pinching, Slapping, Biting, Kicking, or Spanking. (1), There Was a Substantiation of Child Maltreatment. (1), and Toxic Plants Were Accessible to Children. (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.

Aug 28, 2025 2 Findings ● 2 Important

- **A Child Was Handled in a Rough Way, Including Shaking, Pushing, Shoving, Pinching, Slapping, Biting, Kicking, or Spanking.**

On 8/22/25, a staff member pulled a four-year-old child aggressively by the child's lower leg/ankle, resulting in a fracture to the child's lower shinbone/ankle.

- **There Was a Substantiation of Child Maltreatment.**

On January 6, 2026, the Division substantiated child maltreatment regarding a child sustaining a physical injury. Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from provider on 2/3/2026

Jan 13, 2025 2 Findings ● 2 Important

- **Toxic Plants Were Accessible to Children.**

Due to the removal of fencing in one area and extensions of fencing in another holly trees and berries are now accessible to the enrolled children. Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from provider on 1/24/2025

- **Air Conditioning Units Were Accessible or Did Not Have a Guard to Keep Objects From Being Thrown Into the Unit.**

The fencing around the air conditioning units was removed and not replaced leaving the units accessible. Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from provider on 1/
