- **Children Were Not Adequately Supervised at All Times.**

A child was not adequately supervised in the bathroom. Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from provider on 5/17/2024

- **The Center Did Not Have Developmentally Appropriate Equipment and Materials Accessible Daily.**

In the classroom designated for one year olds, toys and materials were stored on shelves not accessible to children. Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from provider on 5/17/202
