- **Each Child Did Not Have an Opportunity to Be Outdoors Daily, if Weather Conditions Permitted.**
Infants are not being taken outside daily. Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from provider on 11/4/2025
- **The Center Did Not Have Developmentally Appropriate Equipment and Materials Accessible Daily.**
Some of the classrooms did not have enough accessible materials. In the two year old room they did not have sufficient art, music, or books. In the preschool room there were not enough book
- **A Safe Indoor and Outdoor Environment Was Not Provided for the Children.**
On the outdoor space there was a broken air conditioner cover, a broken concrete block, and small pieces of glass. Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from provider on 11/4/2025
