The food served for lunch was not listed on the posted menu. Children were served spaghetti, meatballs, green beans, apple sauce, wheat bread and milk. The following w

There was not a dirty toy bin maintained or any mouthed toys that were removed from the children's environment in space #2. Violation confirmed corrected b

● **Equipment and Furnishings Not Meeting the Requirements Outlined in Child Care .0601(b) and (C) Were Not Removed or Made Inaccessible.**

Books were monitored in poor repair in spaces #1 and #2. Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from provider on 2/20/2026
