(1), and Each Staff Member Did Not Have the Required Medical Report, Proof of Tuberculosis Test or Screening And/or Completed Health Questionnaire in a Medical File,... (1). ● **Balloons Were Accessible to Children.**

Mylar balloons were in the building accessible to the children during the visit that were left out from an event at the facility the night before. The balloons were removed during the visit, Violation corrected during visit

● **Children Were Not Adequately Supervised at All Times.**

A four-year-old enrolled preschool child was left unsupervised for approximately forty-five minutes when the class left the room to attend a special event in the gym. The required CSR (name-to-face) forms were not completed so the
