(1), and A Violation Was Found for Which There Is No Item Number. (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.

A bottle was propped on the tray for an infant seated in a high chair in space 3. Violation corrected during visit

A staff member's purse was observed on the countertop by the sink in space 8. This is a violation of a requirement in 15A NCAC 18A .2820(g) which states: Purses and other personal effects belonging to child care center employee
