(1), and The Center Did Not Maintain Records as Required in Rule, And/or Were Not Made Available to the Division for Review. (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.

The Outdoor playground inspection could not be located but there was a trend that it was done the same day as the fire drill. Violation corrected during visit
