Across 2 inspections since 2025, the issues cited most often were Plastic Bags, Materials That Could Be Torn Apart and Toy Parts Small Enough to Be Swallowed Were Accessible to Children Under Three Years of Age. (2), A Safe Indoor and Outdoor Environment Was Not Provided for the Children. (1), and Operator Has Not Scheduled and Obtained a Fire Inspection Within 12 Months of the Previous Inspection. (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.
