(1), A Child Care Operator Did Not Notify the Division of Any New Child Care Providers, as Defined in G.S. 110-90.2(a)(2), Who Were Hired or Moved Into the Child... (1), and Shelter-in-place or Lockdown Drills Were Not Practiced Every Three Months And/or Drill Record Was Incomplete. (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.

● **A Safe Indoor and Outdoor Environment Was Not Provided for the Children.**

On the playground mulch measured one inch around the slide, climber and jeep versus the required six inches. A small section of the fence was loose around the pole post which measured 5 inches which is an entrapment

● **A Child Care Operator Did Not Notify the Division of Any New Child Care Providers, as Defined in G.S. 110-90.2(a)(2), Who Were Hired or Moved Into the Child...**

care facility within five business days. All current staff were not linked to the facility's roster. Violation pending provider

● **Shelter-in-place or Lockdown Drills Were Not Practiced Every Three Months And/or Drill Record Was Incomplete.**

The last shelter-in-place drill was documented on 12/14/2025. Safety drills were not practiced every three months. Violation pending provider response

● **Openings in Equipment, Steps, Decks, Handrails, and Fencing Were Not Less Than 3 1/2 Inches or Greater Than 9 Inches.**

The opening in the playground fence entrance/exit gate measured five inches at the closure railing. Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from provider on
