Across 1 inspection since 2026, the issues cited most often were Minimum Staff/child Ratios and Group Sizes for the Number and Ages of Children in Care Were Not Met. (1), Diaper Changing Surfaces Were Not Cleaned with a Detergent Solution and Disinfected After Each Use. (1), and All Corrosive Agents, Pesticides, Bleaches, Detergents, Cleansers, Polishes, Any Product Which Is Under Pressure in an Aerosol Dispenser, and Any Substance... (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.

● **Minimum Staff/child Ratios and Group Sizes for the Number and Ages of Children in Care Were Not Met.**

A caregiver was supervising six children ages 0 to 12 months for 10 minutes. The facility is approved for a staff-to-child ratio of 1:5. Violation corrected during visit

● **Diaper Changing Surfaces Were Not Cleaned with a Detergent Solution and Disinfected After Each Use.**

One diaper-changing surface had exposed pressboard, which could potentially allow bacteria to grow. Violation confirmed corrected by follow-up visit made by consultant on 5/15/2026

● **All Corrosive Agents, Pesticides, Bleaches, Detergents, Cleansers, Polishes, Any Product Which Is Under Pressure in an Aerosol Dispenser, and Any Substance...**
