(2), Shelter-in-place or Lockdown Drills Were Not Practiced Every Three Months And/or Drill Record Was Incomplete. (1), and All Staff Did Not Review the Center's EPR Plan During Orientation And/or on an Annual Basis with the Trained Staff. (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.

- **Shelter-in-place or Lockdown Drills Were Not Practiced Every Three Months And/or Drill Record Was Incomplete.**
A shelter-in-place or lockdown drill was not practiced every three (3) months. Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from provider on 1/16/2026
- **All Staff Did Not Review the Center's EPR Plan During Orientation And/or on an Annual Basis with the Trained Staff.**
Documentation of the review was not maintained on file.
