On the playground used by infants and toddlers, the wood and lattice structure covering the electrical boxes has broken in several places and has an exposed nail. Violation confirmed corrected by letter received fr

● **All Walls and Ceilings Including Doors and Windows Were Not Kept Clean, Free of Visible Fungal Growth, and in Good Repair.**

The exit door in space 1 was jammed and did not open easily. When forcefully opened, it separated at the bottom, the bottom frame and some insulation came off. V

● **A Safe Indoor and Outdoor Environment Was Not Provided for the Children.**

The exit door in space 1 was jammed and did not open easily creating a hazard in the event of an emergency. The sandbag walls outside of space 1 and space 7 impeded the fire exit creating an unsafe environment. V
