(1), and The Prevention of Shaken Baby Syndrome and Abusive Head Trauma Policy Was Not Reviewed with New Staff Prior to Providing Care with Children And/or a Signed... (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.

A current activity plan was not posted in Space #1 and Space #2. This was corrected when the staff member posted a current activity plan. Violation corrected during visit

● **Minimum Staff/child Ratios and Group Sizes for the Number and Ages of Children in Care Were Not Met.**

There were eleven children with one caregiver. The ages of the children were infant through three years of age. This was corrected when another caregiver assisted in the classroom. Vio

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● **Children Under One Year of Age Were Not Kept Separate From Children Two Years and Older.**

The children under one year of age were not kept separate from children two years and older. This was corrected when another caregiver redirected the children two years and older outdoors. Violati

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
