Outside there is a tree with pods hanging down where children could potentially reach or eat them. This tree needs to be trimmed back to still provide shade but be out of a child's reach. Also grass needs to be t

● **Parent's Medication Authorization Did Not Include Required Information.**

The permission form did not include a start and end date on it. Another medical action plan was not legible and a new one needs to be completed by the parent. Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from

● **Operator Has Not Scheduled and Obtained a Fire Inspection Within 12 Months of the Previous Inspection.**

Operator did not submit the original approved report to DCDEE within one week of the inspection visit on a form provided by the Division. The last fire inspection was on July 25, 202

● **Staff Required to Receive On-going Training Had Not Completed the Required Number of Hours According to Their Education and Experience.**

Several staff have not completed their required in-service training hours for the year. Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from provide
