Across 2 inspections since 2025, the issues cited most often were A Current Schedule Was Not Posted for Each Group of Children for Reference. (1), Electrical Outlets and Power Strips, Not in Use, Which Were Located in Space Used by Children Did Not Have Safety Outlets or Were Not Covered with Safety Plugs... (1), and Plastic Bags, Materials That Could Be Torn Apart and Toy Parts Small Enough to Be Swallowed Were Accessible to Children Under Three Years of Age. (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.
