Across 2 inspections since 2025, the issues cited most often were All Staff Did Not Successfully Complete Certification in First Aid Appropriate to the Age of Children in Care. (1), All Staff Did Not Successfully Complete Certification in CPR Training Appropriate to the Age of the Children in Care. (1), and Children Were Not Adequately Supervised at All Times. (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.

- **All Staff Did Not Successfully Complete Certification in First Aid Appropriate to the Age of Children in Care.**
Verification of staff completion of First Aid training from an approved training organization was not in the staff file. One staff member's first aid expired with a date of 1
- **All Staff Did Not Successfully Complete Certification in CPR Training Appropriate to the Age of the Children in Care.**
Verification of staff completion of the CPR course from an approved training organization was not in the staff file. One staff members CPR expired with a date of 12/11

Jun 5, 2025 3 Findings ● 3 Important

- **Children Were Not Adequately Supervised at All Times.**
The teacher for the infant/toddler children walked out of the classroom to answer the door at the front of the building. Violation confirmed corrected by follow-up visit made by consultant on 6/12/2025
- **Children Under One Year of Age Were Not Kept Separate From Children Two Years and Older.**
While the teacher for the infant/toddler children prepared lunch the five and six year old children were combined with the infants and toddlers. Violation confirmed corrected by follow-up visit ma
