(1), and The Child Care Operator Did Not Comply with All State Laws, Federal Laws And/or Local Ordinances That Pertain to Child Health, Safety, and Welfare, as Required... (1). Based on observation of diapering documentation, two children did not have their diaper checked or changed for over 3 hours an

● **All Stationary Equipment, More Than 18 Inches High, Was Not Installed Over Protective Surfacing.**

Accessible to infants and toddlers in care, the climbing stationary equipment with a slide measured at 18 inches high was not installed over protective surfacing. The violation was correct
