(1), The Medical Action Plan Was Not Updated on an Annual Basis or When Changes to the Plan Were Made by the Child's Parent or Health Care Professional. (1), and Medication Authorization, Giving the Caregiver Standing Authorization Did Not Meet the Specifications in Rule. (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.
