Across 2 inspections since 2025, the issues cited most often were For Children Under Three Years of Age, Materials Were Not Made Available to Children on a Daily Basis. (1), There Were No Clean Clothes Available for the Children to Wear When Children's Clothes Became Wet or Soiled. (1), and A Safe Indoor and Outdoor Environment Was Not Provided for the Children. (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.

- **For Children Under Three Years of Age, Materials Were Not Made Available to Children on a Daily Basis.**
The teachers had the materials up on a shelf where the children were not able to reach and use the materials. Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from provider on 6/1/2026
- **There Were No Clean Clothes Available for the Children to Wear When Children's Clothes Became Wet or Soiled.**
There were eight children that did not have clothes when children's clothes became wet or soiled. Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from provider on 6/1/2026
- **A Safe Indoor and Outdoor Environment Was Not Provided for the Children.**
There was a sharp nail exposed on a shelf where the children's toys were kept. This was corrected during this visit. On the toddler playground, there was cement exposed at the bottom of the fence. This is a safety hazard.
- **Each Employee's Personnel File Did Not Contain an Annual Staff Evaluation and a Staff Development Plan.**
Two staff did not have their annual staff evaluation and a staff development plan in their files. Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from provider on 6/1/2026
