(1), and Children's Records That Include an Application for Enrollment, Medical and Immunization Records, and Permission to Seek Emergency Medical Care Was Not on File... (1). An infant in space 1 was observed eating baby food; however, his feeding plan stated he only drinks formula. Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from provider on

Diapers covered in plastic were observed under the diaper changing table in space 4 and accessible to children. Violation corrected during

for each child. A child, two years of age, had a medical report on file; however, it was not signed by a medical professional.
