On the playground, several sections of the black border surrounding both the climbing structure and the playhouse have become cracked or broken. Border near both entrances of the section that surrounds the playhouse is broken. The

● **The Depth of the Loose Surfacing Was Not Based on Critical Height of the Equipment.**

Mulch surrounding the climbing structure is showing the ground underneath and is not of adequate depth. Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from provider on 4/8/2026

● **Children Were Not Adequately Supervised at All Times.**

When the teacher stepped onto the bus, she left another preschool child unattended on the sidewalk. Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from provider on 12/9/2025

● **Each Child Was Not Attended to in a Nurturing and Appropriate Manner, or in Keeping with the Child's Developmental Needs.**

School bus video showed that the teacher in question was stepping onto the bus, speaking loudly to the child, and forcibly knocking the child's hand down away from
