Across 3 inspections since 2026, the issues cited most often were Plastic Bags, Materials That Could Be Torn Apart and Toy Parts Small Enough to Be Swallowed Were Accessible to Children Under Three Years of Age. (2), Each Infant Was Not Served Only Bottles Labeled with Their Individual Name. (1), and Staff/child Ratios Applicable to a Classroom, Were Not Posted in Each Classroom. (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.

● **Each Infant Was Not Served Only Bottles Labeled with Their Individual Name.**

A child in Infant B was given the wrong bottles to drink during two feedings. Violation corrected during visit

● **Staff/child Ratios Applicable to a Classroom, Were Not Posted in Each Classroom.**
