(1), For Children Under Two Years of Age, Time and Space for Sleeping, Eating, Toileting, Diaper Changing, and Playing Was Not Provided According to Child's Needs. (1), and When Children 3 Years and Older Were in Care, Screen Time Was Not Used to Stimulate a Developmental Domain; Was Not Limited to 30 Minutes a Day and No More... (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.

In space 4, twenty-four children ages one to five were present watching a movie. Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from provider on 12/15/2025

● **For Children Under Two Years of Age, Time and Space for Sleeping, Eating, Toileting, Diaper Changing, and Playing Was Not Provided According to Child's Needs.**

Two children one years of age had fallen asleep in the bye bye buggy while engaging in screen time. Violation confirmed correc

● **When Children 3 Years and Older Were in Care, Screen Time Was Not Used to Stimulate a Developmental Domain; Was Not Limited to 30 Minutes a Day and No More...**

than a total of two and a half hours per week, per child; and/or was not documented on a cumulative log or the activity plan that

● **Screen Time Was Offered to Children Under Three Years of Age.**

Nine children under the age of three were offered screen time. Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from provider on 12/15/2025
