(1), A Drug or Medication Was Administered Without Written Authorization And/or Instructions From a Child's Parent or Authorized Health Professional. (1), and Caregivers Did Not Document Compliance with Visually Checking on Sleeping Infants Aged 12 Months or Younger And/or the Documents Were Not Maintained for A... (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.

In spaces 3, 5, 7, children were not placed 18 inches apart or seperated by a partition. In space 3 the mats were touching, in space 5 the mats were 14 inches apart and in spa

● **A Drug or Medication Was Administered Without Written Authorization And/or Instructions From a Child's Parent or Authorized Health Professional.**

In space 1, one over-the-counter authorization form had expired, one authorization form did not have the dates filled out, and the emergency

minimum of one month. In space 3, two infants sleep checks were not monitored for 25 minutes. The time the children woke up was no
