Across 2 inspections since 2025, the issues cited most often were Equipment and Furnishings Not Meeting the Requirements Outlined in Child Care .0601(b) and (C) Were Not Removed or Made Inaccessible. (1), Medications Including Prescription and Non-prescription Items Were Not Stored in a Locked Cabinet or Other Locked Container. (1), and Each Child Was Not Immunized as per Article 6 of Chapter 130A and an Immunization Record Was Not on File Before or Within 30 Days After Admission. (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.

I observed a non-working toilet in space #3 and does not have a tank lid. Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from provider on 3/23/2026

● **Medications Including Prescription and Non-prescription Items Were Not Stored in a Locked Cabinet or Other Locked Container.**

I observed adult Tylenol cold & flu and Tylenol tablets in a bag hung on the back of the entrance door for space #2. Violation confirmed corrected by letter rec

● **Each Child Was Not Immunized as per Article 6 of Chapter 130A and an Immunization Record Was Not on File Before or Within 30 Days After Admission.**

A child enrolled on 9/10/25 has an immunization record dated 8/29/23. Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from provider on 3/
