(2), Children Were Not Adequately Supervised at All Times. (2), and A Child Was Restrained as a Form of Discipline and the Child's Safety or the Safety of Others Was Not at Risk. (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.

Aug 19, 2024 1 Finding ● 1 Important

● **Children Were Not Adequately Supervised at All Times.**

A three year old child was left outside on the playground unattended for approximately fifteen minutes. Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from provider on 9/6/2024

May 31, 2024 3 Findings ● 3 Important

● **Children Were Not Adequately Supervised at All Times.**

An infant child crawled out of the infant classroom and into the hallway and was unsupervised by facility staff for 35 seconds. Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from provider on 6/12/2024

● **Each Child Was Not Attended to in a Nurturing and Appropriate Manner, or in Keeping with the Child's Developmental Needs.**

Staff members have observed the staff in Infant room 1 using an inappropriate tone when addressing the infants and using inappropriate redirection tactics when man
