(1), A Safe Indoor and Outdoor Environment Was Not Provided for the Children. (1), and Beds, Cots and Mats Were Not in Good Repair, Properly Handled, Stored, or Clean and Sanitized Between Users. (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.
