The mulch on the older playground structure around the fall zones was less than 2 inches in-depth. Violation pending provider response
- **The Child Care Administrator and All Staff Did Not Complete the Recognizing and Responding to Suspicions of Child Maltreatment Training Within 90 Days Of...**

- **Minimum Staff/child Ratios and Group Sizes for the Number and Ages of Children in Care Were Not Met.**
On November 5, 2025, a staff member was out of ratio where they were responsible for seven (7) infant children ages 0 to 12 months. Violation confirmed corrected by follow-up visit mad

Oct 9, 2025 2 Findings ● 2 Important

- **Parent's Medication Authorization Did Not Include Required Information.**
In space #1 two tropical medication forms did not have all the pertinent information in order to correctly apply the ointment. Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from provider on 10/14/2025
