Space #2, one (1) emergency medication missing the parent signature authorizing the facility to administer the medications should the child

● **Application Did Not Have a Medical Action Plan Attached for Any Child with Health Care Needs Such as Allergies, Asthma, or Other Chronic Conditions That...**
