Staff member D.L. had one (1) out of the ten (10 required training hours for this past year. Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from pr

● **Shelter-in-place or Lockdown Drills Were Not Practiced Every Three Months And/or Drill Record Was Incomplete.**

Since School started 8/18/25, an emergency drill should have been conducted no later than September 2025 Violation confirmed corrected by letter received from provider on 10/2
