(3), Suitable Precautions Must Be Taken to Eliminate All Conditions in Areas Accessible to Children Which Pose a Safety or Health Hazard. (1), and Thereafter a Medical Statement Will Be Required When an Event or Condition Reasonably Calls Into Question a Caregiver's Ability to Provide Safe and Suitable Chi (1).
