Across 2 inspections since 2024, the issues cited most often were All Paths of Egress on the Interior and Exterior of the Home, Including Corridors, Aisles and Approaches Must Be Kept Free of Obstructions, Impediments and Debr (2), All Matches, Lighters, Medicines, Drugs, Detergents, Aerosol Cans and Other Poisonous or Toxic Materials Must Be Stored in Their Original Containers, and Must B (2), and Cribs, Bassinets and Other Sleeping Areas for Infants Through 12 Months of Age Must Include an Appropriately Sized Fitted Sheet, and Must Not Have Bumper Pads, (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.
