Across 3 inspections since 2024, the issues cited most often were A Firm Clean Crib, Cot, Bed or Washable Padded Mat of Age-appropriate Size and Construction Must Be Provided for All Children Requiring a Rest Period. (2), Children Unable to Sleep During Nap Time Shall Not Be Confined to a Sleeping Surface (Cot, Crib, Etc.) but Instead Must Be Offered a Supervised Place for Quiet (1), and All Paths of Egress on the Interior and Exterior of the Home, Including Corridors, Aisles and Approaches Must Be Kept Free of Obstructions, Impediments and Debr (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.
