Across 3 inspections since 2025, the issues cited most often were Caregivers Who Will Be Responsible for Administering Medications Must Receive Training in the Methods of Administering Medications Prior to Administering Any Me (2), Protective Caps, Covers or Permanently Installed Obstructive Devices Must Be Used on All Electrical Outlets That Are Accessible to Children. (2), and All Paths of Egress on the Interior and Exterior of the Home, Including Corridors, Aisles and Approaches Must Be Kept Free of Obstructions, Impediments and Debr (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.
