(2), Each Employee and Volunteer Must Complete a Minimum of Thirty (30) Hours of Training Every Two Years. The Required (30) Hours of Training Every Two Years Is Sub (1), and Trash, Garbage and Combustible Materials Must Not Be Stored in the Furnace Room, or in Rooms or Outdoor Areas Adjacent to the Home That Are Ordinarily Occupied (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.
