Across 3 inspections since 2026, the issues cited most often were Caregiver Supervision-Provide Oversight of Caregivers to Ensure That Assigned Duties Are Performed Adequately (1), Evacuation-Must Practice Severe Weather Drill at Least Once Every 6 Months From Date of Last Severe Weather Drill (1), and First Aid Kits-Each One Must Contain Cotton Balls (1). Of 5 total findings, 1 was critical.
