● 5 Important

Across 4 inspections since 2024, the issues cited most often were The Provider Was Out of Compliance with Rule R381-100-11)(c) by a Caregiver Not Knowing the Number of Children in Their Care at Any Time. In the 2/3's Room, the Caregiver Did Not Know the Number of Children in Their Care. This Was a Repeat Rule Noncompliance as Noted on 4/5/2024. (2), The Provider Was Out of Compliance with Rule R381-100-13(8) by Not Ensuring That Standing Water That Measured 2 Inches or Deeper and Five by Five Inches or Greater in Diameter Was Inaccessible to Children. In the Head Start Classroom, There Was a Bucket of Water That Was Greater Than 2 Inches Deep A (1), and The Provider Was Out of Compliance with This Rule by Not Documenting Each Toddler's Diaper Changes Within an Hour. At the Time of the Inspection, the Diaper Change for One Toddler From the Previous Day Had Not Been Documented Within an Hour. This Was a Repeat Rule Noncompliance. (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.
