Across 2 inspections since 2024, the issues cited most often were The Licensee Was Out of Compliance with R381-100-11(1)(a) by Failing to Ensure That Each Caregiver Provides and Maintains Active Supervision of Each Child. During the Inspection, the Investigator Observed That Children Were Left Unsupervised on the Playground When Their Caregiver Came Into the Cente (1) and The Provider Was Out of Compliance with This Rule by Having Plastic Bags Large Enough to Fit a Child's Head Accessible to Children Younger Than Five Years Old. In the Kinderprep Room, There Were Plastic Garbage Bags on a Shelf Accessible to Children. This Was a Repeat Rule Noncompliance. (1). None of the 2 findings were critical.
